Green Team



Hi, I'm Elaine Ferris, and I'm from First United Methodist in Mason, MI (Just south of Lansing). I've been Green Team coordinator for awhile – looking for ways we can share and care for our environment – doing or just thinking about how!

This issue's recycling champs are: <u>Scrap Creative Reuse</u> in Ann Arbor MI. Started in 1998 by teachers looking to rehome classroom materials, it was modeled after the Boston Children's Museum recycling program. Originally a resource for craft supplies, it's now a nonprofit organization and serves as a model across the nation. Their web page even has a Getting Started page for

those who'd like to set up a craft reuse center in their town/area. It's mostly for crafts – office paper, architectural stuff, jewelry, craft books. See annarbor.scrapcreativereuse.org for more information.

Tip for pill bottles: Two suggestions (besides being the perfect size for holding quarters for the Laundromat, or q-tips) are

- 1) a survival kit matches and cotton balls to start a fire, a single edge razor blade, and duct tape or twine around the outside. They are liquid proof so the matches are kept dry. Add fishhooks and fishline if you like.
- 2) a first-aid kit a few bandaids, small tube of ointment, some q-tips, aspirin.

For ideas on small survival kits, I recommend Dick Francis' novel *Longshot* – actually a mystery, but it has some good survival techniques in it, including a kit in an Altoids tin if you don't happen to have a spare pill bottle!

Taking care of the earth is not just recycling, it's a philosophy including not wasting in the first place. Like the lady whose entire unrecycled waste for *2 years* fits into one quart Mason Jar (www.youtube.com/watch?v=ZTouqEPzbdo); or my newest "discovery" – Earthships, sustainable off-grid living (for more: earthship.com). I'll talk about them next time!

What can you do? One very tiny start: if you don't already have one, get a reusable water bottle. One plastic bottle a day is 365 in the trash in a year.
