PRESIDENT'S LETTER

The calendar says that spring is right around the corner. That's a change that most of us look forward to. And there's a word I've used so many times — CHANGE. You may recall that in the last issue of *The Messenger* I told you the Michigan Conference of the United Methodist Church was reducing the number of districts from nine to seven. You may also recall that I indicated that some of us may find ourselves no longer a part of the Mid-Michigan District. Much to my surprise, all of our units will be in a new district. The Mid-Michigan District has been eliminated. Well, not eliminated, but renamed. Some of our units will be in the Heritage District, some will join Central Bay or East Winds.

The seven Michigan districts as of July 1, 2023 are: Northern Skies, Central Bay, Western Waters, East Winds, Greater Southwest, Heritage, and Greater Detroit.

Much of the Midwest District is now encompassed within the Western Waters District. Northern Waters is now encompassed within the Northern Skies District. The borders are now easier to define, inasmuch as they are county lines.

For example, the following counties will be in the new Heritage District: Eaton, Ingham, Livingston (including Milford Oak Grove in Oakland County), Jackson, Washtenaw (including Plymouth First in Wayne County), Hillsdale, Lenawee and Monroe.

While the Michigan Conference United Methodist Church will make the changes effective July 1, Michigan Conference United Women in Faith, its districts and units, will REMAIN the Mid-Michigan District until **December 31, 2023**.

Mid-Michigan District will have its final annual celebration on September 20, 2023, at the Mt. Hope United Methodist Church in Lansing. Much of the regular business won't be necessary. However, there will be leadership development presentations for all unit leaders, lunch, recognitions, and a special presentation by Pastor Carolin Spragg that promises to inspire and entertain. More details will be provided in the next *Messenger*.

In this issue, you will find the registration for our annual Spritual Growth Retreat at St. Francis Retreat Center in DeWitt on May 12-13. In addition to the information on the registration form, please note that we will have a gently USED BOOK SALE/EXCHANGE. Donations from this sale/exchange will be used to support Missions.

I pray that you and your units have enjoyed programs and participated in mission activities this winter. Please know that any of your District Leaders would be happy to present a program to your unit. You need only reach out.




ADULT STUDY

Living the Kin-dom by Riva Tabelisma

This study gives fresh eyes to the Lord's Prayer. Often learned by rote, the Lord's Prayer is a rich guide for how we can live out God's kin-dom in our lives. Tabelisma invites participants in this study to step away from our automatic recitation of the prayer and dive deep into the meaning of each line over the course of eight one-hour sessions. Each of the sessions examines a section of the Lord's Prayer from Matthew 6:9–13 as it is recorded in the New Revised Standard Version of the Bible.



HOW YOU CAN "SAVE THE PLANET" JUST BY THINKING

One of the most critical aspects of learning was explained yesterday in a presentation aimed at readying teens in high school for life later on. It's a surprise to me, but research has shown that within three years after employment, grades have ceased to be any measure of success.

What does continue to be a measure is creative flexibility. Basically, not finding another way to solve a problem; instead, asking <u>is this the right problem to solve</u>?

This caused me to sit back and think a minute. How often have we wracked our brains to figure out "is this the right way to do the program, the devotions, the daycare ... like we've always done it" when the question we could have asked was "is this the way that is most effective and best conveys the point we wish to make?"

I'm sure you have read a number of articles and listened to presentations on how to save the Earth — reduce, reuse, recycle comes to mind along with <u>recyclingraccoons.org</u>. But try thinking in terms of what is personally sustainable and can be turned into habit — one piece at a time. Turn it upside down — is the event needful? What can we do instead to accomplish the goal? Are we reaching who we want to serve?

In an everyday example: think about buying with minimal packaging. In a microwave breakfast package you get a box, two cardboard folders and two film wraps. The cardboards are lined with foil and not recyclable. The box may not be either unless you have a boxboard option. If you, instead, had boiled eggs, you could even use the shells for compost. And offered up the egg cartons on social media for a local farmer—or use them to start seedlings — if you thought ahead and buy the compressed paper ones, they are even compostable. New egg cartons cost almost 60 cents nowadays. Just one change — but small changes can make a difference. It can be overwhelming... but if we change one habit a week, or a month, it will add up. Let's keep God's creation going strong — think for a different world!

Do just one thing — and think about it!




BOOK REVIEW

There is a book that comes highly recommended. That book is **A Knock at Midnight** by Brittany K. Barnett. Brittany was only a law student when she came across the case that would change her life forever — that of Sharanda Jones, single mother, business owner, and like Brittany, a black daughter from the rural south. A victim of America's devastating war on drugs, Sharanda had been torn away from her young daughter and was serving a life sentence without parole — for a first-time drug offense. In Sharanda, Brittany saw haunting echoes of her own life, as the daughter of a formerly incarcerated mother. As she studied this case, a system came into focus in which widespread racial injustice forms the core of America's addiction to incarceration. Moved by Sharanda's plight, Brittany set to work to gain her freedom.

This had never been the plan. Bright and ambitious, Brittany was a successful accountant on her way to a highpowered future in corporate law. But Sharanda's case opened the door to a harrowing journey through the criminal justice system. By day she moved billion-dollar deals, and by night, she worked pro bono to free clients in near hopeless legal battles. Ultimately, her path transformed her understanding of justice in the courts, of genius languishing behind bars, and the very definition of freedom itself.

Brittany's riveting memoir is at once a coming-of-age story and a powerful evocation of what it takes to bring hope and justice to a system built to resist them both.
