Nancy Snell (Westwood UMC, Kalamazoo) will share details of her trip on the Civil Rights Bus Tour that she organized in October 2021. Experience first-hand the sights, sounds, tastes and voices of those who lived (and still live) under the oppressions of racial injustice. The trip included stops at the National Civil Rights Museum, the Legacy Museum and National Memorial for Peace and Justice, the

Rosa Parks Freedom Rides Museum, and a walk across the Edmond Pettus Bridge in Selma, Alabama. Nancy will also lead us in singing the songs of the Civil Rights Movement. Come and learn how you can "get on the bus" to expand your understanding of racial justice issues.

Participants grow in understanding the mission of the church in the current world context. Conference events are open to members and non-members of United Methodist Women.



Who Can We Be Together? A Biblical Exploration of Luke 13, written by Candace Simpson brings participants deeper into Jesus' teachings in this chapter of Luke to explore what it means to be in community.

As the author notes, "For followers of Christ 2,000 years later, it's important for us to sit with the range of emotions we have in response to these words. It's not easy to build and sustain communities, especially when there are forces that drain us, exhaust us, and even push us to act uncharacteristically. And yet, we are called to act on the most ethical principles of our faith so we can witness the kin-dom of God on earth."

Who Can We Be Together? can be adapted to a variety of settings outside of the Mission u format, including Sunday school, distance learning and other church school settings.

NEWS FROM OUR DISTRICT TREASURER

We understand that fund raising efforts over the last few years have been challenging. Despite the challenges, our Midwest District United Methodist Women sent a total of \$26,314.40 to the Michigan Conference treasurer: \$22,841 through 5 Channels of Giving, \$1,304.00 in Supplemental giving, and \$2,168.84 in A&MD funds were returned. We were \$3,685.60 short of our \$30,000 Budget for 2021.

Our Pledge to Missions for 2022 is \$25,000. As United Methodist Women, we continue to look for new ways to support the United Methodist Women's ongoing effort to transform the lives of women, youth, and children in the United States and around the world.

DO YOU KNOW ...

- Your Unit could be a 5 Star Unit? Each Unit that sends a minimum donation in each of the 5 channels of giving will be recognized as a 5 Star Unit. (Minimums: \$5 Pledge to mission, \$40 for Special Mission Recognition, \$5 for gift to mission, \$5 for gift in memory, and \$5 for World Thank offering)
- You could be a 5 Star Person? An individual from any local unit can give personally in all 5 channels of giving with a minimum donation of \$60 (\$5 for pledge to mission, \$40 for Special Mission Recognition, \$5 for gift to mission, \$5 for gift in memory, and \$5 for World Thank). There is a form on the MI Conference UMW website Michigan Conference United Methodist Women (umwmichiganconference.org), left side, partway down the page. The Local Unit treasurer gives this form to anyone who wants to individually give in all 5 channels of giving. The local Unit Treasurer sends the form along with the donation to the District Treasurer. The individual will receive a "5 Star" pin, which will be presented at your District Annual Meeting (usually in September or October). With consecutive years of personal giving, you could earn a 5-year pin, a 10-year pin, or even a 20-year pin.
- You may order cards to go with your Gift to Mission giving? You may send a Gift to Mission on its own, or you may choose to honor someone by giving a Gift to Mission in their name. There are a variety of cards available either individually or in packs of 10 (\$50) or packs of 5 (\$25). Christmas cards are also available in packs of 5 (\$25) only. The inside of all cards reads "A Gift to Mission has been given in your honor through United Methodist Women." Local treasurers order Gift to Mission cards through me.

I'm sharing this information with you; maybe as new information, or maybe just as a reminder. Many wonderful reasons for Mission giving. There's no limit! If I may help you in any way, please let me know. May God bless you and keep you in His care,

NEW RESOURCES AVAILABLE FROM UMW

As many of you know, there is a new *Daily Prayer Guide* available through the United Methodist Women. This guide replaces the United Methodist Women's Prayer Calendar; the new name reflects its devotional features. From surveys that were conducted by the United Methodist Women, it was determined that most members used the prayer calendar for reflection and connection, rather than as a calendar or appointment book. Therefore, it was decided that the prayer calendar would be revised to become more of a prayer guide.



I recently received my copy of the 2022 Daily Prayer Guide, and I love it! Each week begins with a short reflection for Monday, along with a list of lectionary readings for each day of the week. Tuesdays show "Your Gifts at Work" to help you learn more about projects supported by United Methodist Women. Wednesdays are mid-week prayers. Thursdays are weekly advocacy days with scriptural reminders of God's justice and compassion in the world. Fridays list birthdays for staff and mission personnel that week to guide you in prayer for those carrying out our work.

Other features included in the *Prayer Guide* are:

- Weekly pages with holidays
- Directory of Mission Personnel
- List of Places of Service and National Mission Institutions
- At-a-glance calendar for 2022 and 2023
- Maps to help locate places of service and National Mission Institutions

These words are on the front of the Rehace Puerto Rico work shirts from Team #001 Middleville/Michigan Conference. Although not a UMW sponsored activity, four of the seven team members were "mature" females who worked from January 15-22, 2022 in the Arecibo area roofing and painting. As I wiped the sweat that dripped from under the hard hat (80 degrees in the hot sun), I reflected on *our UMW commitment to live by our actions of faith, hope, and love throughout the world*.

In both households the adult male had physical challenges limiting ability to work on roofs in need of repair or replacement due to damage from Hurricane Maria in 2017. Rebuilding physical structures is certainly primary and projects are scheduled over a year out! Employment in construction provides opportunities but also programs that support emotional needs after a disaster are being addressed. Originally UMCOR supported the work but FEMA is now providing funding/employment and the Michigan Conference team was the first one since March 2020 to provide volunteer assistance. Yeah Michigan! Social Action is WHEREever you model and practice your faith, hope and love in WHATever project and for WHOever is in need.
