

Exciting news from the Charter for Racial Justice Committee of the Michigan Conference United Women in Faith! We are currently accepting applications for S300 mini grants. Local units are being encouraged to creatively develop projects to expand their understanding of racial issues. The format is strictly left up to the

Unit. Some past projects have included: attending an inner-city puppet show, visiting local historical museums and presenting a panel discussion on racial experiences among others.

Applications will be accepted until all available funds have been granted. If your application is accepted and a grant is awarded to your unit, we ask that you send a short report to the Charter for Racial Justice Committee upon completion. We would also like a representative of your unit to give a short presentation about your project at the Michigan Conference Annual Celebration in Essexville, Michigan, in late October 2024. (A video submission would also be welcome).

Your submitted application should include the following information:

- Name of Unit, contact person name, address, e-mail and phone number
- Grant amount you are requesting and details on how the funds will be used
- Goals you hope to achieve and estimated number of people participating
- Beginning and ending date of project
- · Any additional information to help us understand your plans
